MULTI-MEDIA TECHNICIAN II

NATURE OF WORK IN THIS CLASS:

Performs skilled work in the maintenance, repair and testing of audiovisual equipment.

Work is performed under general supervision and may lead less skilled workers on assigned tasks.

ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK: (Any one position may not include all the duties listed, nor do the examples cover all duties which may be performed.)

Performs the full range of skilled level multi-media technician repair work.

Maintains, repairs and tests a variety of audio-visual equipment, including the more complex items such as copying machines, classroom television monitors, video tape recorders, line amplifiers, television cameras, and associated equipment normally used in studio production.

Performs tests and checks to ascertain the exact cause of failure; repairs or replaces components.

Constructs or modifies electronic circuits.

Makes work reports.

May lead and instruct less skilled workers.

Performs related duties as required.

MINIMUM KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND SKILLS:

Knowledge of the maintenance, repair and testing of audio-visual equipment.

Knowledge of electronic and electricity.

Ability to operate audio visual equipment.

Ability to interpret and work directly from diagrams, sketches and schematics.

Ability to use a volt ohm meter and other test instruments.

Ability to maintain record of work performed and prepare reports.

Ability to apply safe work practices on the job.

Skill in the maintenance and repair of audio-visual equipment.

MINIMUM EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING:

- (A) Four years of experience in the maintenance, repair and testing of audio-visual equipment; or
- (B) Any acceptable equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the minimum knowledge, abilities and skills.
